(Honours & General) courses (Under CBCS System) through online merit based system will be done for the session: 2018-19. Students intending for admission into B. A./B. Sc./B. Com (Honours & General) Courses may apply on payment of Rs. 100/- (excluding bank charges, if any) to through on-line process.

On-line Forms for admission into UG Courses at the cost of **Rs. 100/- (Rupees one hundred)** per subject will be available from the College website – www.tamraliptamahavidyalaya.org or www.tmvadmission.in from **08.06.2018 (12:00 NOON) to 20.06.2018 (11:59 PM)**.

Last date of online payment: **21.06.2018 (11:59 PM)**.

Read and follow the undermentioned frequently asked questions and answer very carefully before submission of on-line application form.

01	What are the minimum eligibility criteria for application?	<p>a) To apply for Honours Courses the candidate must have got either 50 % in Subject or 45 % in aggregate (to be calculated by adding marks obtained in five best subjects).</p> <p>b) To apply for General Courses the candidate must have got pass marks in at least five subjects.</p> <p>c) Students seeking admission for Honours in History, Philosophy & Political Science will be allowed to apply, even if they have not studied these subjects in H.S. level.</p> <p>d) Students seeking admission for Honours in</p>

		<p>Economics & Accountancy will be allowed to apply, even if they have not studied these subjects in H.S. level but they must have Mathematics in H.S. level.</p> <p>e) Students seeking admission for Honours in Computer Science will be allowed to apply, if they have studied Computer Science at H.S. level, otherwise they must have studied Mathematics in H.S. level.</p>
02	Whether any student passed out in 2015 or before that can be eligible for application?	No student passed H.S./equivalent Examination in 2015 can be eligible for application. Only the students passed H.S. Examination in 2016, 2017 & 2018 can be eligible to apply.
03	Whether any student, having passed H.S. in and after 2015, but having failed at the Graduate level can reapply?	<p>Students having passed H.S. in and after 2015, but having failed at the Graduate level can be eligible for reapplication only if,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ a candidate got admitted earlier in the College but became unsuccessful and lost all chances in Part-I, he/she may be permitted for admission in 1st year in the Academic Session: 2018-2019 only after taking special permission from the Secretary, UG Council, V.U. <p>Prayer for special permission for admission forwarded by the College Authority must be submitted at VU between 08-06-2018 and 20-06-2018. Special Permission will be issued to the candidates by VU on & from 25-06-2018 to 29-06-2018.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✚ at the time of Counselling/Admission they submits their special permission letter from the Secretary, UG Council, V.U., old original Registration Certificates & the failed mark-sheets to the College. <p>N.B.:- To prevent any candidate from suppressing the matter, he/she will have to give an undertaking that he/she was not registered previously by the V.U. & that he/she is not pursuing any other course simultaneously.</p>
04	What is the Eligibility for the students passed out from other Boards and/or other Courses?	<p>a) Students passed out from other Boards can be eligible for application. But, at the time of Counseling for those students, migration certificate or documentary evidence of having have applied for migration is to be submitted & verified.</p> <p>b) The students passed out from Vocational Courses are eligible to apply only in General Course.</p>
05	How is the Merit-Point calculated in the preparation	<p>a) For Honours Course: Merit Point = Marks obtained in the Subject (or</p>

	of merit list?	<p>allied subject marks) for which admission in Honours is sought + 10 % of the aggregate marks in H.S. (excluding the marks obtained in Environment Science).</p> <p>b) For General Course: Merit Point = Marks obtained in aggregate in H.S. or Equivalent Courses.</p> <p>N. B.:- Aggregate marks means highest marks obtained in five subjects including language group and optional subjects (if any).</p>
06	Whether a candidate can apply in more than one Honours Course and in General Course?	<p>a) Yes, an applicant can apply in more than one honours subjects as per their choice in separate application form with the payment of Rs. 100/- for each honours subject.</p> <p>b) To apply in general courses separate application form to be filled in with the payment of Rs. 100/-.</p> <p>c) Any applicant with an application form in honours course shall not be allowed to take admission in general courses.</p>
07	How can a candidate choose elective subjects or Combination subjects?	<p>a) For Honours Course: The honours candidates seeking admission into BA Hons. Courses will have to select one honours subject and two elective subjects as per the table of subject combination for UG honours courses given in the website. However, the honours candidates seeking admission into B. Sc. Hons. Courses including Mathematics, Geography & Economics Hons. (See N.B.) will have to select only Hons. Subject. Their combination subjects will appear CBCS as default.</p> <p>b) For General Course: The candidates seeking admission into general courses will have to select three general subjects as per the table of subject combination for UG general courses given in the website.</p> <p>N.B.:- Candidates willing to take Computer Science, Physical Education, Education, Nutrition, Music and Geography as elective/combination subjects shall have to pay departmental development fees in addition to admission fees as mentioned in the table of ADMISSION FEES.</p>
